

Message from Rev. Majima

“Good and Evil Within Us — Reflections for Bodhi Day”



In traditional kabuki theater, performances often featured symbolic characters representing “Good” and “Evil.”

Old woodblock prints often depicted these figures in dynamic, dance-like poses, each with a large character on the chest—one reading “Good,” the other “Evil.”

They face one another boldly, almost as if engaged in a spirited dance.

People enjoyed these images because they expressed something universal: the inner tug-of-war we all experience.

Human hearts are complex.

Someone who seems selfish may suddenly show deep kindness.

Someone admired for their goodness may act harmfully in a moment of weakness.

Good and troubled impulses rise and fall within us moment by moment.

No one is entirely one or the other.

This month, we observe **Bodhi Day**, the day Shakyamuni Buddha attained awakening.

According to tradition, as he sat beneath the Bodhi tree, “demons” appeared and tried to obstruct his enlightenment. But these demons were not external beings.

They were the shadows of fear, doubt, pride, and craving—arising from within his own heart.

By recognizing them clearly and refusing to run away, the Buddha opened the path to enlightenment.

As the year comes to an end, we may also notice the “soot” that has accumulated in our hearts: fatigue, irritation, regret, or quiet worries. We cannot sweep them away perfectly. But we can gently acknowledge them through reflection.

That honest recognition becomes our own **inner year-end cleaning**.

May we close this year with gratitude, and with hands together, whisper *Namo Amida Butsu* in our hearts—the words of thanks that remind us we are embraced just as we are.

Sometimes I hear, “My friends want me to talk more at school. But if I say what I really think, maybe they won’t like me.” Maybe you have felt this too.



Some people say their ideas right away.

Listening brings you many good things.

When we listen kindly, we understand people better, we help our families and friends feel happy and cared for, and we make our homes and schools happier places.



You don’t have to say everything you think. You don’t have to speak before you’re ready. A gentle heart and open ears are just as precious.

As the New Year comes, think about this:

Did I listen well?
To my mom and dad?
My grandparents?
My teachers?
My friends?



If the answer is “not always,” that’s okay.

The Buddha is smiling at you and saying,
“You can try again today.”

Message from Rev. Majima

 京都の西本願寺では、毎年十二月二十日に「すす払い」が行われます。一年のあいだにお寺に溜まった煤を払う
 おおそうじ ごぜんしちじ ちか おお ふ あいず ほんがんじ そうりよ
 大掃除です。午前七時、ご門主が四メートル近くある大きなほうきを振られるのを合図に、本願寺の僧侶、そして
 おお もんと よこいちれつ なら たけ ぼう いっせい たたみ かり ひと ま あ ほこり
 多くのご門徒が横一列に並び、竹の棒で一斉に畳を叩き始めます。係の人は、舞い上がった埃を二メートルほ
 そと おく だ
 どのうちわであおぎ、外へと送り出していきます。

でんとう れんにょしょうにん じだい ごひやくねんいじょうつづ たいせつ ぎょうじ いちねん ふ かえ あみださま
 この伝統は蓮如上人の時代から、五百年以上続いてきた大切な行事です。一年を振り返りながら、「阿弥陀様、
 しんらんしょうにん ことし せわ れい もう あ とうと ごおんほうしゃ いとな
 親鸞聖人、今年もお世話になりました」とお礼を申し上げる、尊い御恩報謝の営みでもあります。

しんらんしょうにん むみょうぼんのう ちりかざ ごと へんまん の じぶん つごう み ほか
 親鸞聖人は、「無明煩惱しげくして塵数の如く遍満す」と述べられました。自分の都合だけが見え、他のいのち
 みうしな わたし すがた むみょうぼんのう しめ ぼんのう ちり かざ
 とのつながりを見失っていく私たち。その姿を「無明煩惱」と示され、その煩惱は塵の数ほどもあって、この
 せかい み い たた たた ま あ まえ み ほこり
 世界に満ちている、と言われました。まさに、叩けば叩くほど舞い上がり、前が見えなくなる埃のようなもので
 す。

ほら お てら あさひ こ ひかり くうきちゅう ま ちり あ いっぼん ひかり すじ
 すす払いの終わりごろ、お寺に朝日が差し込んできます。その光が空気中を舞う塵に当たり、一本の光の筋と
 あらわ ひかり ちり すがた う あ
 なって現れます。光があるからこそ、塵の姿が浮かび上がるのです。

 光の筋が見える時、同時に塵も見える。これは、阿弥陀様と私たちの関係に似ています。阿弥陀様の光が明ら

 かになるとき、同時に私の闇、煩惱の姿も明らかになるのです。塵ほどに多い煩惱は悲しむべき事実でありなが

 ら、その場所こそが、一筋の阿弥陀さまの光が差し込む場でもあります。

The 90th Anniversary of the Reedley Buddhist Church will be celebrated on April 25, 2026.


